This is the same view Inkosi Ntshingwayo kaMahole had when he commanded the battle of Isandlwana. One important fact to note is that the Zulu Chest arrived approximately 30 minutes after the arrival of the first engagement which covered the location of Mkwene hill and of Baza's kraal soon after this first engagement E and F company's moved back to the firing line and soon afterwards the Zulu chest arrived and then the main attack began it was from this same command position Inkosi Nthingwayo orderd Mkhosana kaMvundlana to urge his men on after the attacked stalled " The little Branch of leaves, he cried that extinguished the great fire gave no such order as this" soon after shouting this, a bullet struck him in the head killing him instantly.

IS B ZULCOM PAN TD We can confirm from Uguku testimony that it was the uDholko regiment which was stationed below Qwabi hill acting as the reserves this regiment was also sighted by Commandant Hamilton Brown
